Receiving a greater variety of produce types, available only during the fall season, helps us deliver more diversified loads of dehydrated food aid when the time comes for shipping. On that note, we have been able to share an extraordinary amount of food aid over the last number of months. NCG has been able to send out nearly 11 million servings of food

aid so far this year! Some of the hard-pressed countries who have received our nutritious food aid this year are Chad, Cuba, Eswatini, Guatemala, Haiti, Poland, Romania, and Ukraine. We are thankful for our faithful Christian distribution partners in these countries who ensure that the food is received by those who struggle the most with food security. We are also thankful for some local food banks in our own Niagara Region who have been able to share our products. Our partners have been generous with our food, which is nutrition for a hungry body, all the while being generous with the gospel message, which is food for a hungry soul. Our work at the Gleaners will not be done until the Lord returns and completes his work of restoration. Until then, we are called to have the right spirit as we seek to be a conduit of mercy in a hurting, hungry

world. May we heed the instruction given to us in Colossians 3, "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness and patience." PW

DEDICATED DONOR STREEF PRODUCE LTD.



For over 5 years, Streef Produce Ltd. has donated an abundant amount of surplus vegetables to Niagara Christian Gleaners. If their produce doesn't have a "home" to go to, a quick call to NCG will make sure it's got one! Streef Produce, located in Princeton, Oxford County (in the heart of Ontario) is our featured Dedicated Donor.

Streef Produce started out as a family business 40 years ago with approximately 7 acres and has grown to over 2,400 acres featuring "crops our customers need when they need them." They not only grow their own vegetables, but they have built a strong relationship with other farmers in the area. Their focus is "local Ontario-grown produce, as much as possible." Another large aspect of the business is importing from farms in other parts of North America. You know they have grown when their facilities can store up to 12 million potatoes in a climate-controlled environment!

According to Nathan Streef, not only does NCG benefit from "about a 2% waste" but so does the Ontario Christian Gleaners and Mission to Haiti. Nathan explained that the company used to send crates and crates of sweet potatoes to NCG, but as a market for this product grew, to the demand for items such as sweet potato fries, the donations dropped quite a bit. "But," Nathan says, "when we do have an abundance of any of our vegetables that we need to move quickly, I just make a call to Pete and ask if he can take it."

When asked what has partnering with NCG meant to their company, Nathan says they love knowing that the product is going to someone who can actually use it.

"If it's got a blemish on it and no one wants it, it's probably on only 5% of the vegetable-the other 95% of it is perfectly fine." he said. "We're glad to be a part of the Gleaners. Pete just called us 'out of the blue' about 5 years ago, and we've been involved ever since."
