It's about 8 p.m. on a Wednesday at the Niagara Christian night The cutting tables have Gleaners. been wiped and cleaned, the floors have been swept and washed, and the bowls have been stacked and are drying, ready to be used the next day.

Though the daytime work at NCG has finished, it's about this time that the Evening Dryer Operations are just beginning.

Marinus Koole is one of twelve evening crew volunteers who come in to switch out the carts in the dryers. The dryers are loaded around 10 a.m. on any given morning, and by 8 or 9 p.m., the dehydrating process is done and more carts of freshly diced fruits or vegetables are

ready to be put into the dryers to start the whole process over again. This maximizes the running capacity of the two dryers; they operate about 20 out of a 24 hour period, six days a week. It also means NCG can get the products out faster to those who need it. Marinus loves to do his part by helping in the evenings which, for him, is about one evening a week. "I'm still working full-time, so this gives me a chance to help out," he says. The work takes less than an hour with two people. Marinus' regular partner is Pieter Zijlstra and the two quickly unload the carts out of both dryers and neatly park them in rows where they will be all ready for the morning crew of volunteers. They then move the carts loaded with freshly-diced produce into the dryers, lock the doors securely, ensuring the correct program for the type of produce is selected, and start up the dryers again. Marinus jokes that it takes him almost longer to drive from his home in Pelham to NCG in Smithville, than it takes to do the actual work there!

But that work is vital to the operations of the NCG. It helps to keep the whole process moving smoothly by having the carts switched out and dried product ready for measuring and packaging. When asked about what makes NCG different from other volunteer organizations, Marinus said that the commitment of the core community is exceptional. "And when the NCG needs money for an addition or a specific need, it's always right there," he says. "It's a beautiful thing that we can take surplus food and send it around the world. It's also a witness because of what it says on every box: "We love because He first loved us." 1 John 4:19."

Marinus has volunteered in this capacity for about five years. He and his wife have three children and four grandchildren. Thank you to Marinus and the rest of the evening crewworkers for their important role at NCG! Instead of calling them the Cheerful Choppers we could call them the Mighty Movers! (of the carts) or the Energetic Evening Crew! Well, you get the picture, and we sure do appreciate them.

We here at NCG are still working through some other big changes yet I daresay the changes are all bringing about positive outcomes. Our building addition is still in motion; a number of items are functional and operational, yet more is to be completed. A rotating table that simplifies operation, took a bit to get used to but it is good. Heat exchangers on the dryers took a bit to revamp and adjust but they are good. Altering the building space and trying to work within new confines as a construction project carries on has been challenging but it is good. We are still working on the holding room space, cooler space, various equipment alterations, exterior parking lot changes lots of things to come, but they too will be good. This year, to date, we have been able to handle approx. 20% more produce than last year; a blessing that our produce partners are able to continue to grow in their support to us. It is all good indeed.

As exciting as it is to be immersed in all of this change, we can also find thankfulness and blessing in the fact that some things never change. The love of our God and Father through the gift he gave us in his Son Christ Jesus, the support he shares with us each and every day through his Holy Spirit, these things never change. It is by His hand that Niagara Christian Gleaners has, over the past 6 plus years, changed from an idea to the physical existence what we are working with today. It is by His hand that we are faithfully supported in so many ways – produce, transportation, financial support. Thanks to all for supporting us in our annual Fund-Raising dinner this

past month. It seems so long ago yet just last month over \$130,000 was raised to help carry on in the mission. We thank you for that.
