Preparing our newsletters is always a great way of sharing what the Lord is doing through the ministry of Niagara Christian Gleaners (NCG). On the production side of things, we have been blessed in so many ways. The fresh produce from our grower partners continues to come to us in abundance. Every new load of food spurs us on to stay on task – transforming fresh food into nutritious dehydrated food aid - ready for distribution all over the globe.

Food availability looks different every year. This year, for example, we have received an extraordinary amount of high-quality cabbage from a few growers - 250,000 lbs more than last year. Our growers are always working with many variables, some within their control and many outside of their control. We become aware of this by the amount and type of surplus produce being offered up. Regular communication with our growers is key to wisely managing incoming food donations. Communication with all the Gleaner stakeholders is very important. Thankfully, everything that we do is easy to

understand, and a first-time visitor to the Gleaners is sure to walk away with an accurate picture of the purpose of our mission. In addition to new volunteers coming to check us out, we have some additional opportunities to introduce others to the work of the Gleaners.

BOUNTIFUL BLESSINGS FOOD RECIPIENT • THE LUKE COMMISSION / ESWATINI

The Kingdom of Eswatini is a land rich in culture and resilience—but it is also a nation grappling with persistent poverty, chronic health burdens, and widespread food insecurity. Despite its beauty, over 30% of the population faces acute food shortages, and for many families, the struggle to put a meal on the table is a daily reality. For those already burdened by illness (Eswatini has the highest prevalence of HIV in the world) or unemployment (which stands at 35% or more), the lack of access to food can make recovery or stability feel out of reach.

Since 2019, Niagara Christian Gleaners (NCG) has been partnering with The Luke Commission (TLC), a faith-based health and development institution operating from the Miracle Campus in the center of Eswatini. Over the last six years, TLC has distributed more than 20 million servings of nutritious, dehydrated food. These meals, packed with love by NCG volunteers, have found their way across the globe and into the hands of TLC's patients—many of whom arrive at TLC's doors hungry, sick, and without hope.

In Eswatini, TLC's model of compassionate, integrated healthcare provides more than just medicine—it delivers dignity through an organization scaled to reach 300,000 patients annually. Both at the Miracle Campus and at outreach locations around the country, TLC brings quality healthcare, spiritual encouragement, and food provided through the partnership with NCG. These efforts often reach people who have no other access to care. The gift of food from NCG shared with TLC's patients—who are all referred to as VIPs, or Very Important Patients— can restore more than strength, rekindling hope.

One patient, a mother who traveled several hours with her baby to reach the Miracle Campus, shared her joy at receiving both medical treatment and a bag of dehydrated vegetables to take home. "We came with nothing," she said, "and we are going back with life."

NCG Food Aid is an integral part of TLC's commitment to deliver both physical and spiritual sustenance. In a country where nearly 40% of the population lives below the poverty line and where HIV and tuberculosis are widespread, Food Aid becomes more than just food—it becomes part of a ministry of love.

The importance of this ministry is amplified in a time when TLC is grappling with the impact of a shift in global aid funding. For the first time in its 20-year history, the organization has been forced to significantly decrease the number of patients cared for, due to the termination of a grant from USAID, a major donor of TLC.

From the fields where our excess vegetables are gleaned, to the hearts and hands of our volunteers, to the waiting hands of families in Eswatini, this partnership embodies the truth of **1 John 3:18:** *"Let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth."*

While food alone won't solve all of Eswatini's challenges, every packet of food received assures someone that they are seen, that they matter, and that God has not forgotten them. Through the continued partnership between NCG and The Luke Commission, we are seeing daily proof of God's love in action.
