Building & Deepening Connections

- Much of the month of February seemed to be done around a table & with coworkers -

During the month, our messages focused on the theme, **'Your Kingdom Come: To Our Finances & Belongings.'** We were blessed to have some support (*online/remotely*) from **Winston & Hong Ngee Chong** in Singapore (*Moulmein Church of Christ*) who are not only professionals in the area of finance, but also people of deep faith and goodness. Though finances, giving, and how we think about 'all that we have' can be a challenging topic to tackle, the response of our church family was very enthusiastic, and we heard multiple times that it was very practical and helpful.

As a church, our outreach event for the quarter was a **Soup & Games Night**. Interestingly, it required the least amount of planning and was perhaps the most successful in involving church members' active participation and connecting with the church their family, friends, and coworkers who came. Members brought games for all ages from their homes, and around sixty were in attendance. Held on a Saturday afternoon/evening, we had homemade soups from Japan, Korea, China, Jamaica, Puerto Rico, and America, as well as hot coffee and homemade apple cider.

The following day, the Matsudo Church of Christ members traveled northeastward to Mito from Matsudo city in Chiba. We enjoyed a combined worship, followed by a lunch prepared for us by Grace Huan who has begun a Chinese 'bento' (box lunch) delivery service. The day was so blessed! The Osbornes hosted Manraj Sunar for a meal. He is originally from Nepal, the youngest of seven siblings in a Christian family. His brother became a follower of Jesus first, and slowly he and his parents the rest of his siblings also became followers. Living in Japan the last two years and worshipping with the Hitachi Church while attending language school, he recently moved to Mito to enroll in an elder care/special needs care program for the next two years, and then he hopes to find employment here to keep helping his family in Nepal. They also hosted Kristin's coworker, Kumazaki sensei and his wife. Kumazaki sensei, who will retire at the end of

Manaka's class theme was Winnie the Pooh, and Rei & Kigen's class theme was Mickey & Minnie Mouse. We are wrapping up our series for this fiscal year, **'Your Kingdom Come'** with messages and one last testimony based on **'Your Kingdom Come: To The Rich, The Poor & The Margins.'** We also had another **Mission Sunday** for Cambodia where **218,138 yen** (*approx US\$1500*) was given. Thanks be to God!

Some of the greatest news this month was that **Takumi Ogawa** and **Ami Hoshino** got engaged, and will marry in June this year. Joel and Hiro will begin premarital counseling with them in April. We also celebrated with our newest member, **Ifunanya Chiezie**, who traveled back to Nigeria at the end of March to marry **Joseph Ndinefo** on April 4. Unfortunately she must return two days after the wedding to begin a new job here in Japan, so they will separated for a while while she begins applying for a visa so that he can join her here.

We also celebrated with Jacob, Hikari & Asa Shuart in the birth of their daughter/baby sister, Suzu Rae. The meaning of Suzu is 'pearl' and we can't help but think of the pearl of great price.

Many visitors - some students and families from Ibaraki Christian, some coworkers and neighbors, and others who found us online - joined us throughout the month. It seems that God is sending another wave of new people our way, many of whom are a different levels of seeking Jesus, and even a few Christians who have been hurt by others but desire to worship, serve, and grow with a church family. We want to respond faithfully and hospitably, and pray they can grow in Jesus together with us.

Two former missionaries and beloved friends -Judith Alexander and Crimsen (Ruhnke) Hanson, as well as Crimsen's family - visited us as well and shared in heartwarming conversations. Time with them was sacred.

Most of the teachers in Kristin's grade level at **ICHS (11th grade)**, about 12 in total, came for a **year end party** at the Osbornes house catered by our favourite neighborhood Italian restaurant and chef. Not at all common in Japan, the excitement and interest was high, and it was also a good testimony of the trust Kristin has built with them. (*Unfortunately Joel had the flu, the week before Easter, so he had to 'hide out' upstairs and miss the fun.*)

Mito Church had a **potluck farewell party** for **Matt Miller** who will return to the states in April after 7 years in Japan (*pictured below*). We're sad to see him go but thankful for his impact here.

Next, we must rent vehicles and car seats for our time in Chicago and Ontario. Please pray with us to be led judiciously as we look for rentals. While some expenses have been graciously offset, still the costs that come with traveling and reporting about our mission work are a necessary part of what we do.
