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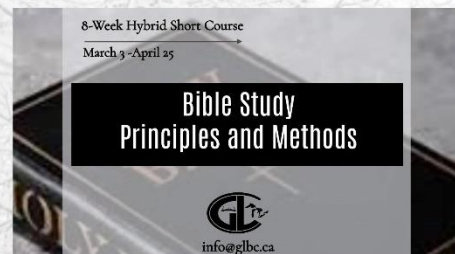


TIMOTHY & TITUS

A verse-by-verse study of 1 & 2 Timothy & Titus in their important historical contexts. Special attention is given to the eternal spiritual truths revealed in these books and the range of teaching, leadership and ministry issues and skills that Paul writes about to Timothy and Titus, two evangelists working in challenging circumstances in Ephesus and Crete. Significant attention is paid to the importance of these letters for building up and equipping the whole body of Christ for ministry in works of service today in the twenty-first century

BIBLE STUDY PRINCIPLES & METHODS

The Bible is the best-selling book in history, yet it is also probably the most misunderstood. It need not be so. God speaks clearly through His Word, giving us principles and examples for interpretation. In this course, we will discuss what God tells us about interpreting His Word and look at examples, from the Bible itself and from church history, to learn what God was saying to the original audience, what he is saying to us, and how we can share that message with others effectively, through close attention to the historical, literary, and cultural contexts of Scripture.

SPIRITUAL FORMATION

The Christian life involves truths we must believe and a character that the Holy Spirit is forming within us (2 Thessalonians 2:13). The second of these components is the focus of this course. The Bible tells us about habits that will facilitate the Spirit's work in us. These include: Bible study, Bible memorization/meditation, prayer, fasting, interacting with other Christians in person, and interacting with them over a distance (in space or in time) through reading and writing. God's people throughout the Christian age (and, for that matter, beforehand) have used these habits, among others, to grow closer to Him. In this course, we first consider what God has said about each habit and then what we can learn about each habit from the example of Christians who came before us.
